6. (a) Explain the significance of satellite links in news reporting. Describe the coordination required for satellite bookings and the role of local editing facilities in field reporting.

- (b) What are the benefits and challenges of using modern technology like satellite phones, broadband, and 4G-based solutions for field reporting in journalism ?
7. (a) Examine the role of technology in transforming the modern newsroom. How have tools like satellite links, optical fiber, and internet-based solutions impacted the way news is gathered, produced, and distributed.
